Speaker: Emily Andrews, U.S. Green Building Council
Benchmarking is the key to effective building performance improvement and establishing a solid return on investment. After all, you can't manage what you don't measure.
- **Benefits of the "Building Energy Awareness" ordinance**
Speaker: Rajiv Ravulapati, Technical Advisor for the City's Building Division
Rajiv will provide an overview and benefits of the St. Louis' energy benchmarking ordinance. Effective in 2017, privately owned buildings and municipal buildings in St. Louis that are 50,000 square feet or more are required to be benchmarked, and owners must disclose annual energy and water consumption. Requiring large building to benchmark and report their energy use on an annual basis has been shown to be an effective driver of behavioral, operational and capital improvements to building energy performance.
- **Benchmark and then what?**
Speaker: Jeff Kelley, Ameren Missouri BizSavers Program
Jeff's focus will be on the "then what" and what energy efficiency projects to pursue and how they will improve benchmarking scores. The program has a goal setting feature, so if you set a goal, what is the best way to achieve it? He will give examples that are cost effective and encourage customers to use their incentive programs.
