BENEFITS OF THE EBMI

As our mission statement says, EBMI provides programs and services to **educate, communicate and connect** our members, the community and the evolving industry. The **VALUE** is directly related to the **TIME** investment of your company's associates. Our Education Program is of great value but only if someone attends the classes or seminars. The Expo is a great opportunity to see and learn about products, but **ONLY** if you attend.

Education and training - we offer a number of opportunities in classes and seminars. EBMI co-sponsors program with Ameren Missouri and Ameren Illinois to bring up-to date information on a variety of topics.

As the **NEC** changes every three years, our materials stay current to keep participants up-to-date on code issues.

Many industry associates need continuing education hours for license requirements so we assist them in acquiring these hours. Engineers need professional development hours (PDHs) and contractors need CODE hours for licensing requirements with the City of St. Louis and Jefferson County. Our NEC class qualifies for the St. Louis County requirement of attending a code class and passing to begin the electrical license process.

We hold forums for the **Consulting Engineers** community to discuss issues involved with their projects.

EBMI Corporate members can send associates to our classes and seminars at a discounted rate.

Electrical Expo is held every three years that offers the industry education seminars and learn about the many industry products all in one location.

Communication - Our newsletter "FLASH" is published monthly and provides industry information. The FLASH is mailed or emailed to our members and also posted on our website.

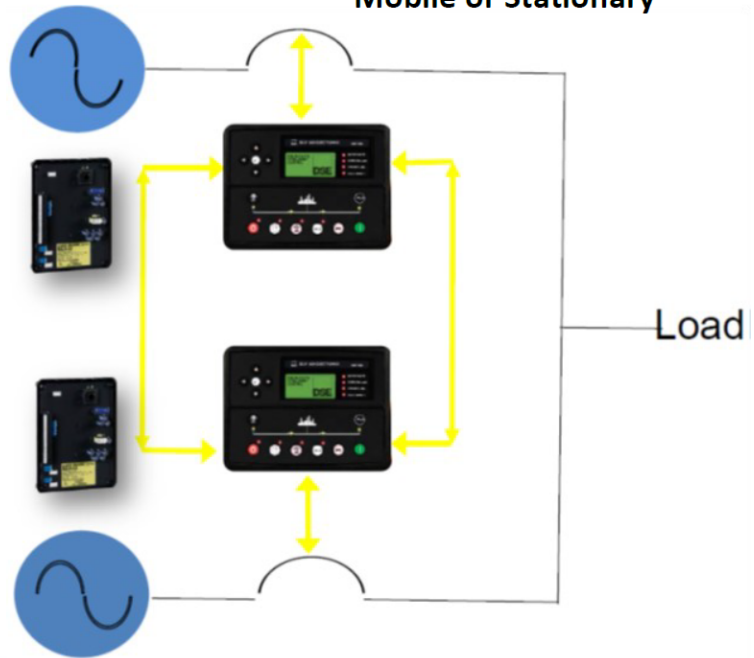
